Student Mobility for studies



The sending Institution must have signed inter-institution agreements with its Programme Country partners before the mobility takes place. Study Periods: from 3 to 12 months (general rule; the duration is established by the agreements)

The study period abroad must be part of the student's study programme to complete a degree at first cycle (Bachelor)n or at second cycle (Master) or at thierd cycle (Doctoral course)

The student must be enrolled at least in the second year oh higher education studies. Study period abroad must be part of the student's study programme to complete a degree at the first/second/third cycle

A single student can receive 1 GRANT for each cycle of study for up to 12 months per cycle (bachelor/ master/ PhD)



Mobility for studies



- 1. The same student may receive grants for mobility period totalling up to 12 months maximum per each cycle of study, indipendently from the number and type of mobility (study/traineeship).
- 3. Prior experience under LLP/Erasmus counts towards 12 months per study cycle.
- 4. The amount of the scholarship varies by the country of destination.
- 5. The mobility for study duration is: minimum 3 months, maximum 12 months.
- 6. A study period abroad may include a traineeship period as well (minimum study period 3 months).
- 7. Students who are nationals of one of the Erasmus+ participating countries and are enrolled at Camerino University are eligible for mobility at a university in their home country provided they are not still resident there. They will anyway not receive priority in the selection process. Moreover they can confirm acceptance of an exchange place obatining a written confirmation from the host university.



Mobility for traineeship



- . New Vocabulary : Placement TRAINEESHIP
- 2. Traineeship from 2 to 12 months.
- 3. The post-graduate training (for fresh graduates, max 12 months) is now part of the *Erasmus* + instead of Leonardo da Vinci.
- 4. The recent graduates may participates in the traineeship, but they must be selected during their last year of study and must carry out and complete their traineeship abroad within one year of obtaining their graduation.
- 5. Students must carry out their mobility activity in a Programme Country different from the country of the sending organization and the country of residence.
- 6. New call will be published next summer (July-September)



Mobility for Studies



The mobility grant will be modulated based on the country of destination, according to the following target groups (as defined by the EC):

GROUP 1 (HIGH cost of living) €280/month

Austria, Denmark, Finland, France, Ireland, Italy, Lichtenstein, Norway, Sweden, Switzerland, United Kingdom

GROUP 2 (MEDIUM cost of living) €230/month

Belgium, Croatia, Czech Republic, Cyprus, Germany, Greece, Iceland, Luxembourg, Netherlands, Portugal, Slovenia, Spain, Turkey

GROUP 3 (LOW cost of living) €230/month

Bulgaria, Estonia, Hungary, Latvia, Lithuania, Malta, Poland, Romania, Slovakia, Former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia



Mobility for studies



Calculation is on daily basis according to the period carried out and documented by the attendance certificate

For example: period: 16/10/2015 to 2/03/2016

15 days in Octobre (from 16/10 to 30/10) + 30 gg x 4 months (Nov-Dec-Jan-Feb) + 2 days of March

Total days=
$$15 + (30 \times 4) + 2 = 137$$

Mobility for studies



first installment corresponding to the 80% of the total amount of the grant within one month from departure.

20% will be paid at the end of the study period, after the submission of the final documentation (individual report online submission)

Students who do not complete any study activity satisfactorily, fail to receive recognition from their Degree Course for what they have done, or do not apply for recognition must return the entire amount of funding they have received.



Mobility for studies/traineeship



OLS Online Linguistic Support

There will be organized courses online provided by the EC in EN /FR / IT / ES / DE to assess language skills before and after mobility.

The OLS language assessment is mandatory for all participants to Erasmus+ mobility activities of at least two months (studies/traineeships) with one of the following languages as the main language of instruction or work: German, English, Spanish, French and Dutch (with the exception of native speakers). The goal is to expand progressively the OLS system to all EU official languages by 2020.

Participants must complete the first language assessment before the mobility to assess their language competences. For higher education students, taking the OLS language assessment before their departure is a pre-requisite for the mobility, except if duly justified. Assessment results do not prevent participants from taking part in the mobility programme, but can be used by the sending institution/coordinating organisation to identify the participants most in need of linguistic support.

Who can Apply



Students who:

- 1. are regularly enrolled at a UNICAM degree course
- 2. are not receiving for the same period another Community contribution provided by other mobility programs *except ERSU scholarships*
- 3. have already renounced the Erasmus grant without valid reasons.
- 4. PhD students without scholarship-Documents:
 - Curriculum vitae (to be enclosed to the application);
 - A letter of recommendation by the Unicam Coordinator



Selection Criteria and Evaluation



- 1. Academic Curriculum: 45%
- 2. Cumulative Grade Point Average: 35%
- 3. Assessment of Linguistic Certification: 10%
- 4. Evaluation of the Motivational Questionnaire: 10%

Note: Credits achieved and recognized in the previous mobility experience will be also taken into account.



Important Considerations

After the ranking



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- 1. Ranking will be published on 13 April
- 2. Destinations will be allocated during the meeting for assignment that will take place from 13 to 27 April
- 3. Acceptance form to be submitted by 15 May.
- 4. All the selected students must visit host University website to check deadlines and application procedures.

Please note that before departure NON-EU STUDENTS that have been awarded an Erasmus grant must timely contact the embassy or the consulate of the destination country in order to verify if further documentation is required for their stay abroad.

To enter some EU countries it is also required an advanced English language certificate (C1).
