A research strategy is simply a plan of how you aim to achieve your research goal.

- A research strategy usually has
 - ♦ A goal: something it can be used for
 - A procedure: steps to follow to achieve results
 - A set of techniques involved in the procedure





Strategy	Goal
Design research	generate an artefact
Case studies	study the characteristics of a real-life instance
Systematic Literature Review	Identify and analyse all relevant knowledge in a field
Action research	iteratively solve a problem with a community of practice
Survey studies	find patterns in data
Experiments	test hypotheses
